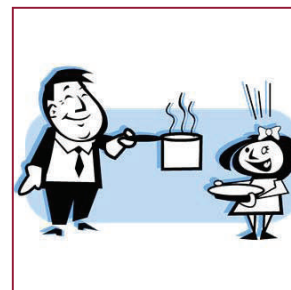

### Scald Injury Prevention

<b>Kitchen:</b>	<b>Bathroom:</b>
Off limits to children for play	Off limits to children for play
Zone of safety around stove, sink, microwave	Hot water heater set at 120 degrees F or less
Careful placement of pots on stove and hot foot/liquids on tables	Bath water: Start with cold and add hot water
Electrical cords and tablecloths out of reach of children	Close supervision 
Use high chairs/pack & play to keep children safe	
Children under 14 years of age should not use microwave alone	See page 4 for more burn injury prevention tips!

Jill has been the Coordinator of Pediatric Burn Services at MUSC since 1997. Previous nursing experience includes adult burn care at MUSC and in Illinois, Medical ICU staffing, Dialysis, and 10 years in the Army Nurse Corps as Charge Nurse of a Field Hospital. Jill graduated from Moline Public Hospital School of Nursing, Illinois, and earned her undergraduate and graduate degrees in nursing at MUSC.

Jill has published several articles in peer-reviewed journals on burn care and burn nursing, including a chapter for the nursing textbook "Acute and Chronic Wounds: Current Management Concepts". Jill actively participates in American Burn Association educational activities, presenting at conferences on topics such as preventing burn injuries, severity of scald burn injuries, and the use of temporary skin substitutes. Jill is an instructor in the Wound Care Specialty program at MUSC College of Nursing. Jill has received numerous awards over her career, including recognition as Palmetto Gold and Health Care Hero.

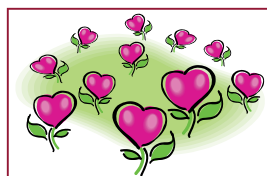

**Contact Burn Prevention**

Inside the Home	Outside the Home
Clothing and curling irons kept in a safe area where children do not have access	"Circle of Safety" around brush and camp fires
Safety zone around ovens, space heaters, fireplaces	Mark burn area off with bricks or rocks to warn of danger
Use of safety gates or screens	Enforce "Circle" at all times as fires can smolder for days



**Flame Burn Prevention**



- WORKING smoke alarms on each level of the home and in sleeping areas
- Teach children at a young age that matches and lighters are TOOLS-NOT TOYS
- FIRE ESCAPE ROUTE: Plan and practice
- Safety checklists are available from local Fire Departments
- NEVER leave an outdoor fire unattended & always have a water supply on hand
